

Connectional Giving: all of us giving together allows United Methodists to do together what we cannot do alone. We join United Methods around the world in 6 special collections

Next Special Collection is **Peace with Justice Sunday** on May 27, 2018. Every first Sunday you can donate to the **Pastor's Discretionary Fund**—this money is used by the pastor to help with immediate needs in the community.



Food Pantry Collection: non-perishable items are collected during the month. Every 1st Sunday of each month the items will be delivered to a local Food Pantry. Fall and winter months are always challenging, and Food Pantries are always empty.



Hope Bags: We are looking for items to fill Hope bags to share with people in a homeless situation around New Haven. So far, our members have distributed more than 100 bags. Praise God! Some ideas are: 1 gallon zip lock bags, socks, cereal bars, water bottles, tissues, soap, deodorant, shampoos, etc. You may also donate money to this ministry and we will shop for you!



U.M. ARMY is an acronym which stands for United Methodist Action Reach-Out Mission by Youth. U.M. ARMY's mission is: "To provide Christ-centered missions that serve people in need and promote spiritual growth and leadership development in youth and young adults."

Again, my thank you to everyone for continuing your support, which has allowed St. Andrew's UMC to continue to continue our really meaningful ministries. I thank God for all of you because it is only with you that our ministries can be successful. God continues to bring us together to utilize our resources and gifts for Him.

As always, we need your help to be responsible stewards of St. Andrews and of all the buildings in our care for many years to come. Besides shutting lights off when not being needed and making sure everything is locked when we leave, it also means we depend on your pledges and financial giving to ensure the growth of our community. With your help we will be able to fulfill our operational obligations and be a vital church helping to serve the community. We are continuing to work on a way to save money with our electricity with UI. Our clothing and furniture drive with Savers brought in \$323.71.

Effective April 1 we changed our insurance to Church Mutual and this will do two things that will help our church out. First there won't be a large payment in January during our large heating and snow removal bill time. Secondly it will save the church a significant amount of money, which will help in our efforts to balance our budget. And by lowering our operating costs it will allow us to invest in more ministries and missions to fulfill our call to help transform the world in Jesus Christ's name.
