And what about our youth, that last summer, spent a whole week, sleeping in the floor of a church, doing chores and engaging in mission through the UMARMY program. We are a powerful church! And we are changing the world in Jesus's name.

I want to make sure you know that you are important here! Your gifts are needed to build the Kingdom and transform the world, your presence, your prayers, your gift and your service are all we need to fulfil our mission. I am grateful for you and for the ways you are embodying God's love in the community. I look forward to more challenges together. So, are you ready to expand even more the walls of the church?

The mission of The United Methodist Church is to "Make Disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world" (Matt. 28:18-20; Matt. 22:36-40). This mission is achieved through vital congregations that equip and empower people to be disciples of Jesus Christ in their homes and communities around the world.

The VitalSigns Dashboard is a tool developed by Brick River through GCFA. This tool allows you to track your weekly worship attendance, professions of faith, small group participation, missional participation and financial giving for your congregation. It is a tool designed to help congregations follow their progress on the goals that they set for each year, based upon the goal-setting challenge initiated by the Vital Congregations work. It is in response to the Call To Action to focus on fostering and sustaining an increase in the number of vital congregations effective in the mission of The United Methodist Church.

Thank you for your continued and faithful support which has allowed St. Andrew's UMC to do really meaningful ministries.

As you all know our annual Giving Campaign was held on Oct. 29th. Thank you to all who have pledged in previous years and those that pledged during this Campaign. We also thank everyone that donates weekly to our plate. As we start a new year we continue to need your help in order to maintain a long future for our church. We will continue to need your help to be responsible stewards of St. Andrews and of all the buildings in our care for many years to come. This means shutting lights off when not being needed and making sure everything is locked when we leave. We have locked in an oil price quite a bit higher than last year so we are expecting higher fuel costs.

During this last year we have replaced the fluorescent bulbs with LED ones to save money on electricity. We also changed our insurance to a new company to save money. And we have changed our electric to a new supplier to help reduce the increased costs expected from our former suppliers. Pancake Day, also called Pancake Tuesday, Shrove Tuesday, Fat Tuesday and Mardi Gras (French for "Fat Tuesday") is the last day of feasting before Lent begins on the following day, Ash Wednesday. It's called so due to the custom of eating pancakes on this day, a tradition that comes from a time when any remaining rich foods were eaten on the day before Lent to use them up, and fasting begins. Pancake Day is a moveable feast whose date is determined by Easter, and it's celebrated exactly 47 days before Easter Sunday. Join us for our Pancake Sunday Celebration on March 3rd after the service. A free will offering will be taken to cover the cost of this special fellowship.

SEASON OF LENT 2019: God on the Move.

Exploring God's work through the travels and teachings of Jesus (adapted from series by Jessica LaGrone)

Jesus didn't stay in one place for long. His earthly ministry was one of moving from one place and encounter to the next. He also moved through every part of the human experience, encountering everything from temptation, to joy, to suffering and even death. This series helps us reclaim the movement of Jesus's ministry from temptation to condemnation, through his teaching and miracles and finally through the story of his death and resurrection. As we encounter the life and ministry of Jesus, we cannot stay the same. We ourselves are moved to grow and change as followers and imitators of the gospel. The confronting truth of Lent is that as we delve deeper into our own self-examination, we find that we are not alone. God still on the move in our lives, walking with us every step as we travel the road to Easter.

3/10 God Moves into the Desert

Jesus' temptation in the desert shows us that God has moved fully into human flesh and can identify with out every experience.

3/17 God Moves Past All Obstacles

Jesus won't let Herod's threats or the people's opposition keep him from fulfilling his loving purpose

3/24 God Moves Over the Fence

Instead of gazing at the grass on the other side of the fence, Jesus bring us back to focus on realities that will bring change and growth in our own backvard


