We the Easter people, today's disciples, are still charged with the same commission that the early disciples had. As we celebrate the resurrection, we must also remember that. Therefore, we must go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey everything that Jesus has commanded us. We must go out of our comfort zone to proclaim the Gospel, to invite others into a relationship with Christ as we grow into our relationship and we must continue to transform the world in Jesus' name.

There is no way around it. There is no excuse. There is no Plan B. Jesus died and resurrected, so we have the privilege to carry on with the greatest news of all, Christ Is Risen, Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia, Amen! Ximena



Season of Easter Worship Guide – Part I: Living

Easter is more than just a day. It is a 50-day season that marks the resurrection of Jesus Christ and the ways we live into that reality, just as his disciples did. The season of Easter has long been a time when newcomers to Christianity and those already on the Christian journey revisit the foundations of the faith. In other words, this is a time when people examine basic doctrines, providing, as Laurence Hull Stookey writes, "a time for both discovery and reconsideration." [1] As a result, our resources will culminate in two four-week series— "Living" and "Loving"—that will focus upon the gospel narratives and ways to integrate these doctrinal pieces into daily Christian living.

The narratives are post-resurrection accounts (Week 2: Jesus and Thomas; Week 3: Breakfast with the disciples), with the exception of Week 4, in which we observe what is often referred to as "Good Shepherd" Sunday. One possible thread to examine is determining how all these actions merge into the greater action of living as a witness of the risen Christ. How do believing, following, and listening intersect to form a way of discipleship in which we confidently share the good news of resurrection? Resurrection is a daily reality, and we live as those marked by the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. According to the pattern in the lectionary, we encounter a unique process, which, interestingly enough, might be the opposite of the way we often consider our faith:

Step 1: Believe **Step 2:** Follow **Step 3:** Listen

4/28 Second Sunday of Easter: Believe in Me

To Live for Jesus is to Believe in Him (Chuck Shit preaching, no communion)

Scripture: John 20:19-31

5/5 Third Sunday of Easter: Follow Me

To Live for Jesus is to Follow Jesus (Rev. Paul Fleck preaching)

Scripture: John 21:1-19

5/12 Fourth Sunday of Easter: Listen to Me

To Live for Jesus is to Listen to Jesus

Scripture: John 10:22-30

PART II: LOVING

This second series focuses on the action of God upon those who believe in and into Jesus and the action stirred among those who believe, thus creating a flow of divine energy from God to the church to the world. All the themes for this series could be subtitled, "by a Loving God"—marked by a loving God, sent by a loving God, and so on.

In the first week, Jesus offers a new commandment to love one another and be known as Jesus' disciples. This "marking" is the way we are known and has direct connections with our baptism into Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. The second week presents a Trinitarian model in which Jesus and the Spirit are sent by God the Father in a self-giving action. The love that comes from God extends from God to the world. Notice in the Scripture for week three that Jesus says, "I made your name known to them, and I will make it known, so that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them" (John 17:26). This is Jesus' indication that his presence will continue as the body of Christ in the world, and those who join in the body of Christ will know the love given from God. On the Day of Pentecost, the church is born to empower people to go forth and proclaim the love of God throughout the world, in languages far and wide. Loving, then, becomes the natural response and embodiment of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. We live into the reality that Jesus is alive, and we love as a result of it.
