Our Vital Signs



The mission of The United Methodist Church is to "Make Disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world" (Matt. 28:18-20; Matt. 22:36-40). This mission is achieved through vital congregations that equip and empower people to be disciples of Jesus Christ in their homes and communities

around the world.

The Vital Signs Dashboard is a tool developed by Brick River through GCFA. This tool allows you to track your weekly worship attendance, professions of faith, small group participation, missional participation and financial giving for your congregation. It is a tool designed to help congregations follow their progress on the goals that they set for each year, based upon the goalsetting challenge initiated by the Vital Congregations work. It is in response to the Call to Action to focus on fostering and sustaining an increase in the number of vital congregations effective in the mission of The United Methodist Church.

Finance Report Nov - Dec 2019

Thank you for your continuing your support which has allowed St. Andrew's UMC to continue its really meaningful ministries.

A lot has changed from the last newsletter. We needed to clean up the parsonage in order to accommodate our new Pastors. In order to save money, many people pitched in and helped with cleaning, removing old items, and painting. I want to thank everyone that pitched in any way to help us accomplish those tasks. During this process we found active termites which led us to contract a company for remediation. During their investigation they also found active termites in the church. While we have had a company treating our buildings for years, they were obviously not getting them all. We are in the process of treating and repairing the damage they have done to both structures which will be an expensive project. Just the treatment will be over \$5000. We are lucky to have a carpenter/handyman that does great work at a good price, and he will continue to work on repairing the damaged areas.



The Sunday School invites all youth ages four and older to join us as we learn the stories of the Old Testament and the teachings of Jesus in the New Testament.

A religious education is a very important part of a child's life. We hope to see our Sunday School grow this year. Please encourage the

young people in your family to participate.


